Ten years later, real guests would drive up her fence-lined lane, ease into the rocking chairs on her front porch and relax into the bucolic setting she created. Selena no longer had a vision. She had a beautiful reality that a decade later is still flourishing.





A Property Designed for Exploration

Part of the B&B on Tiffany Hill's most treasured amenities are the series of seven garden vignettes on the property. Begin your exploratory stroll at the Circle of Trees, some tall, wizened black walnuts that shade a set of Adirondack chairs. Continue to the herb garden that the B&B sources for many of its savory breakfasts. Keep going, though. With every step, there's some new, peaceful experience to discover. Follow the switch back trail-originally tread by the cows that grazed here when the property was a dairy farm--that leads down to what Selena calls the "bottomland" with more whimsical gardens, a life-size birdhouse and trail loops. "The B&B experience is not just sleeping in the rooms and eating the breakfast," she says. "It's a place to go and retreat. It's a place where you can go to just
